
Background: The Public Workforce System Los Angeles County Local Workforce Development Area (LWDA)

7 LWDAs in the LA Basin: LA County, LA City, Pacific Gateway, South Bay, SELACO, Foothill, and Verdugo.

County of Los Angeles LWDA: serving cities that are not part of the other 6 LWDAs within the county's boundaries and all unincorporated areas within the County.

DEO is responsible for the State of California-designated LA County LWDA. DEO, on behalf of Los Angeles County, is the lead entity for workforce development across the County.

AJCC Modernization: Community-Based Organization Required Co-Applicant/ Secondary Subrecipient Requirements

Community-Based Organization RFP Definition:

• A smaller-sized IRS-designated 501(c)3 non-profit entity with an operational budget of no more than \$1.5 million.

CBOs – what is their role?


- To offer specialized expertise in serving priority populations and/or sectors that will lead to better outreach to targeted communities and service quality ultimately enhancing the local workforce development system's ability to build a stronger social safety net, and improve economic and social stability and mobility of individuals and communities served.
- CBOs shall provide one or more WIOA career services as designated by the Primary Applicant/One-Stop Operator in the established CBO Partnership Plan.
- Reference: WIOA Title I Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth@Work Programs Statement of Work, Section 1.7, Comprehensive AJCC Community Based Organization Partnership

What is needed to apply?

- Background and Experience Minimum of 3 consecutive years of experience within the past 5 years. (RFP 3.10.1.1)
- Proof of non-profit organization status and an annual operating budget of no more than \$1.5 million. (RFP 3.10.1.2)
- Financial statements for the past 3 years and submit in Section G, along with Primary Proposer's proposal. (RFP 3.10.1.3)
- Corporate documents as detailed in Sub-section 7.6.11.2 of this RFP (RFP 3.10.1.4)
- Compliance with past County Contracts (RFP 3.10.1.5) as applicable
